Subjects Integrated - EVS and Mathematics

• **Topic** – Visit to a Supermarket

Materials Required –

- o A4 paper
- Glue
- Pictures
- o Basic stationery items

• Instructions (What do you need to do) -

- Visit a nearby supermarket in your neighbourhood.
- Click pictures of the grocery store there.
- Note down the names of any five healthy food items available in the grocery store.
- Draw/paste the pictures of those items on an A4 size paper.
- Write the prices of those items beneath the pictures.
- Now, convert the figures of the prices into number names (Creativity is all yours)
 Eg. 20 = Twenty

Learning Outcome –

- Students will have hands-on experience with a neighbourhood place like a supermarket.
- They will learn the importance of grocery stores in supplying us with things of daily use.
- They will also learn the price in numbers and number names and will sharpen their numeracy skills.

Criteria for Evaluation –

 The observing power of the students in selecting healthy food items and managing the presentation with creativity will be the criteria for evaluation.



Subject - Life Skills

- Topic My Summer To-Do List. (Collage-Making Activity)
- Instructions (What do you need to do) -
 - Children will perform a few activities with their family members or friends from the attachment given below.



- o Click pictures while performing the activities.
- o Paste it on an A4 size sheet to make a collage.
- Also, write a few lines based on their experience.

Learning Outcome –

 Students will be engaged in different hands-on activities and learn new ways of doing things in an organised manner.

Criteria for Evaluation –

 Students will be able evaluated on the basis of their presentation of work and creativity of the collage decoration.



Subject Integrated - GK

- Topic Current Affairs
- Materials required
 - o Pictures as per the questions given below
 - Coloured paper
 - GK notebook
 - Glue

Instructions (What do you need to do) –

- The children need to take out the printouts of the pictures on the questions given below. They need to make a collage with those pictures in the GK notebook.
- Take out the printouts of the pictures regarding the following questions:
 - Who is the President of India?
 - Which is the tallest mountain in the world above sea level?
 - Who composed the National Anthem of India?
 - Name the fastest animal on the Earth.
 - What is the folk dance of West Bengal?
- The pictures must be neatly pasted and labeled. The decoration of the entire work is mandatory and as per their choice.

Learning Outcome –

 The children will acquire knowledge about the world through this activity.

Criteria for evaluation -

- Neatness of the work (How neatly the work has been done)
- Following the instructions properly.
- Creativity (students' original ideas and imaginations will be considered)
- Presentation (How beautifully the work is presented)



Subjects Integrated – English and 2nd Language

- **Topic** "Let's Find the Nouns"
- Materials required
 - o Pictures of the naming nouns.
 - o A4 sheet paper
 - Stationery items

Instructions (What you need to do):


- Students will find out five naming words from the story Mary and the Mouse and write them down on an A4 sheet of paper.
- They will write the same naming words in their respective second language which is Hindi/Bengali.
- After writing the naming words they will paste the picture related to the words.
- Students can click pictures of the naming words (related to the chapter) available at home for example- 'bed'. They can also paste cutouts from Magazines/Newspapers.
- The child needs to make sentences with those naming words and write them in English and in their respective second language.
