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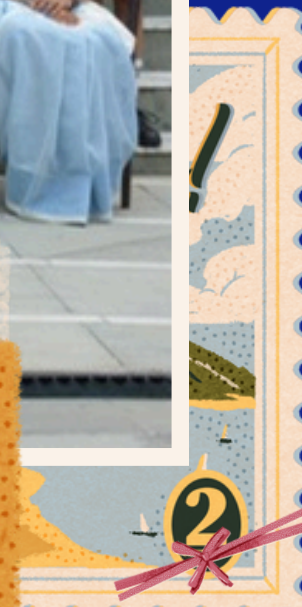

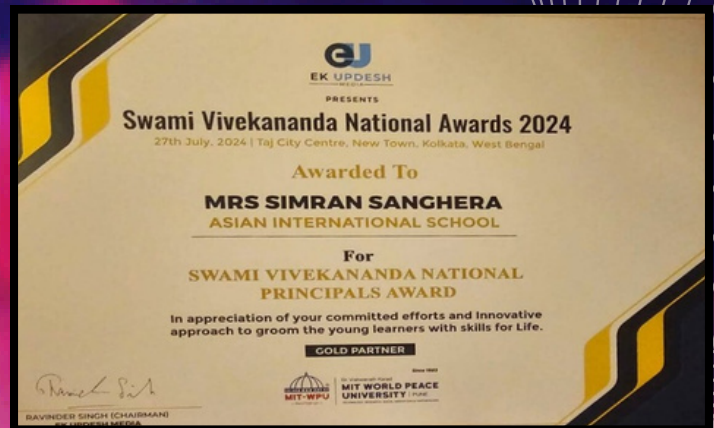

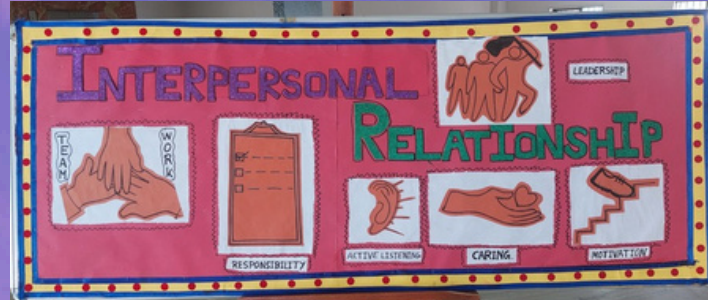

VALUES AND CITIZENSHIP

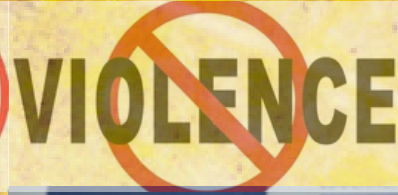

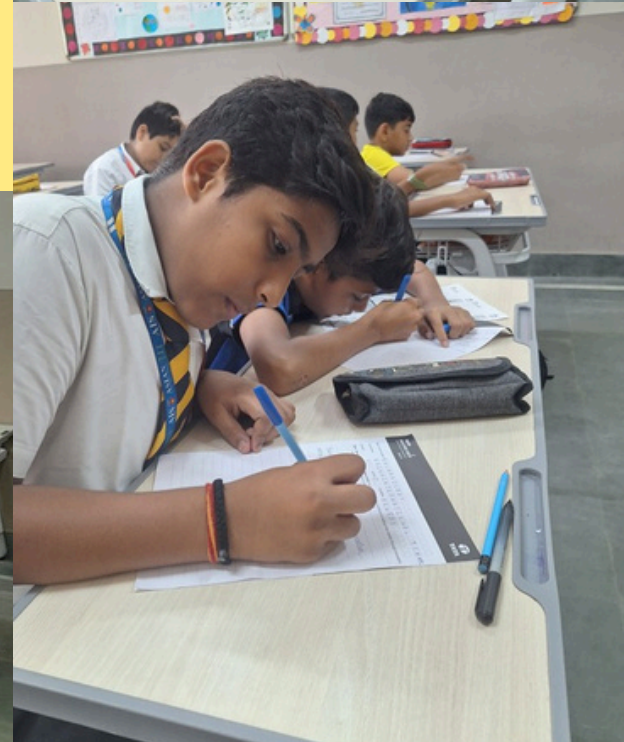

Indian Meteorological Department

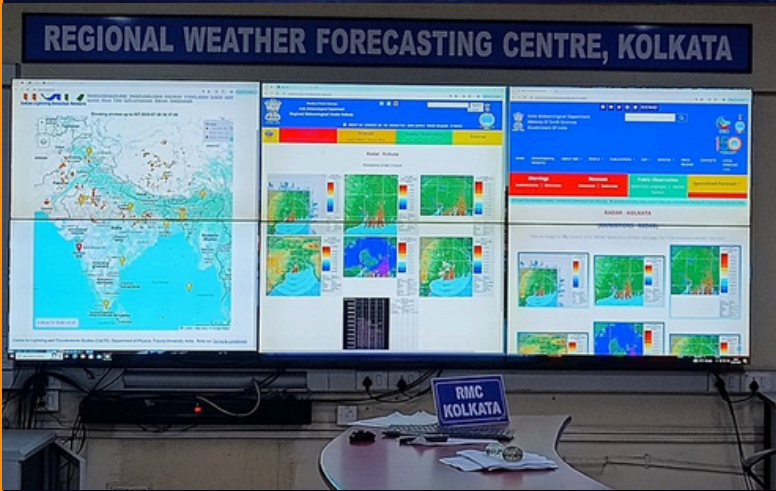

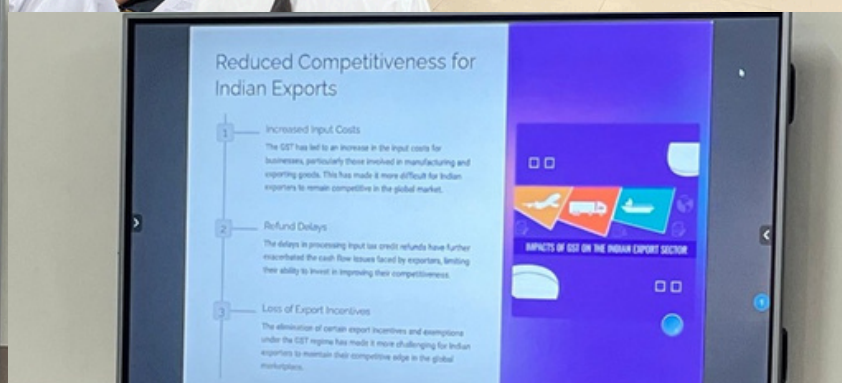
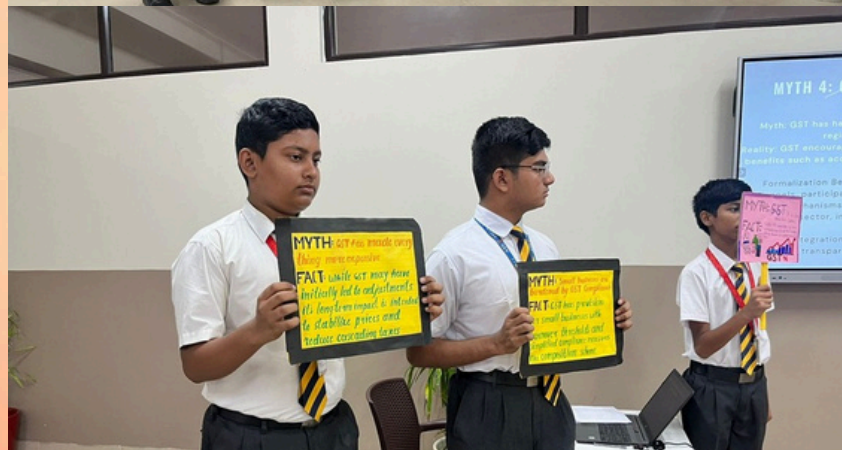
GST AND ITS IMPACT

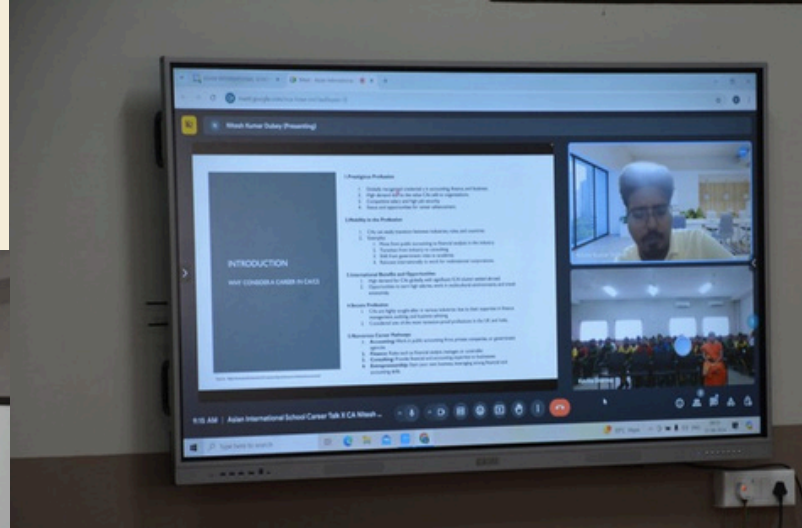
A career talk session was conducted for the students of classes XII A & B ,Commerce section by the AIS Career Cell on 30th August 2024.

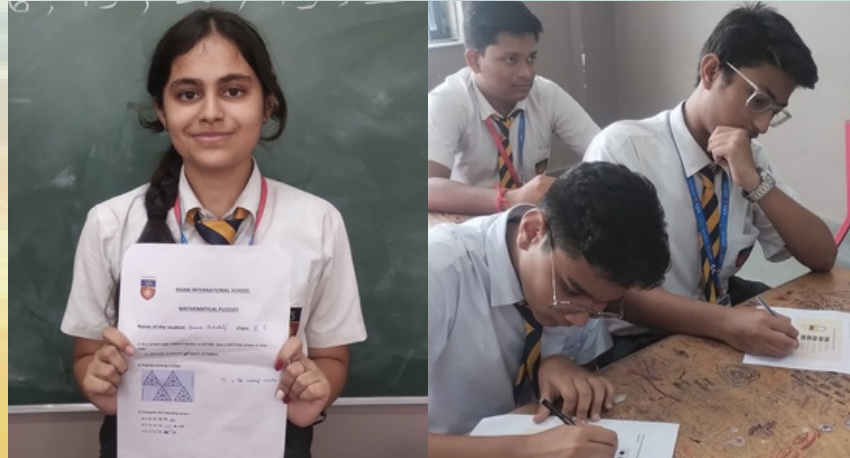

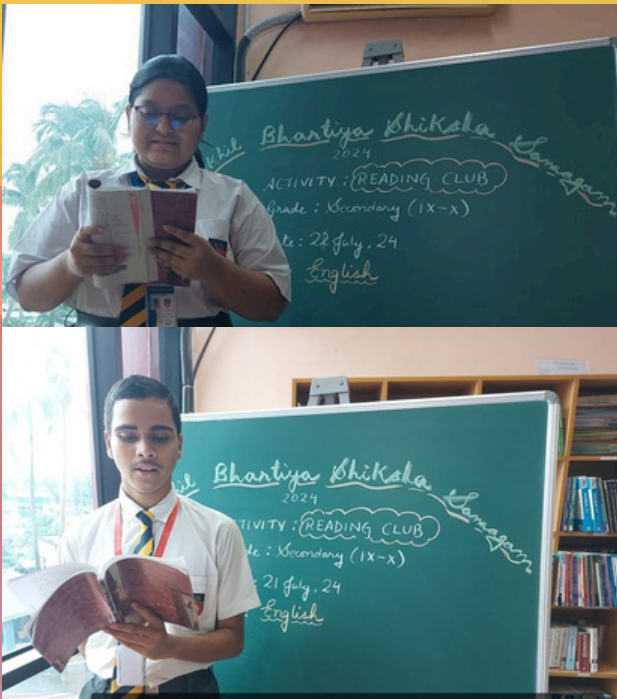


Mathematical Mindbenders

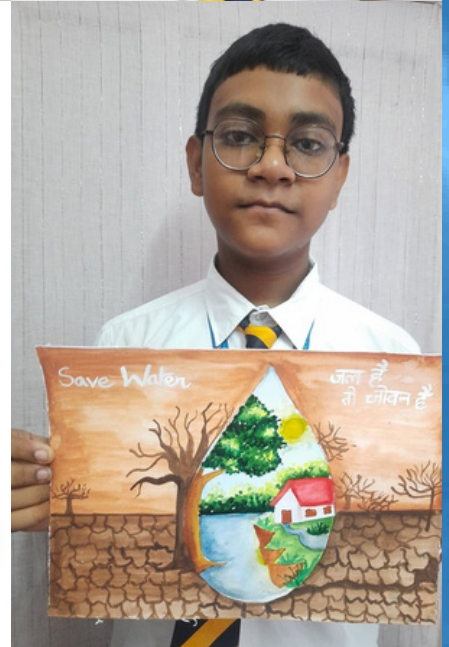
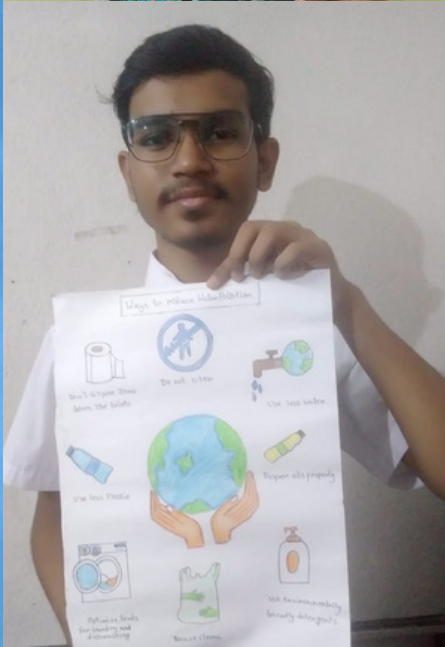
WEAVE A WAY

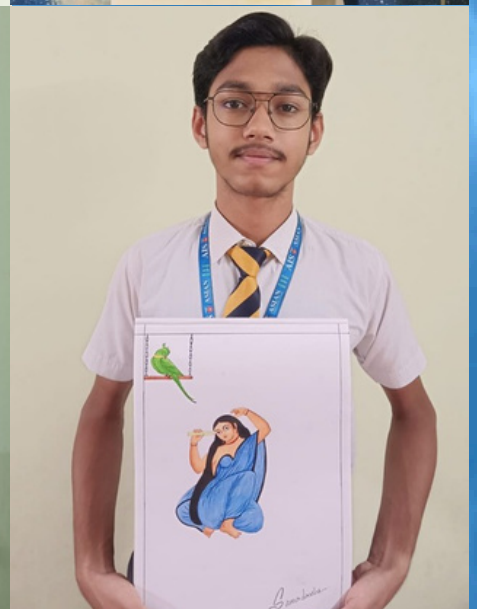
INNOVATIVE IDEAS

An open discussion allowed MHA's to share personal experiences, sparking meaningful connections and collective understanding.

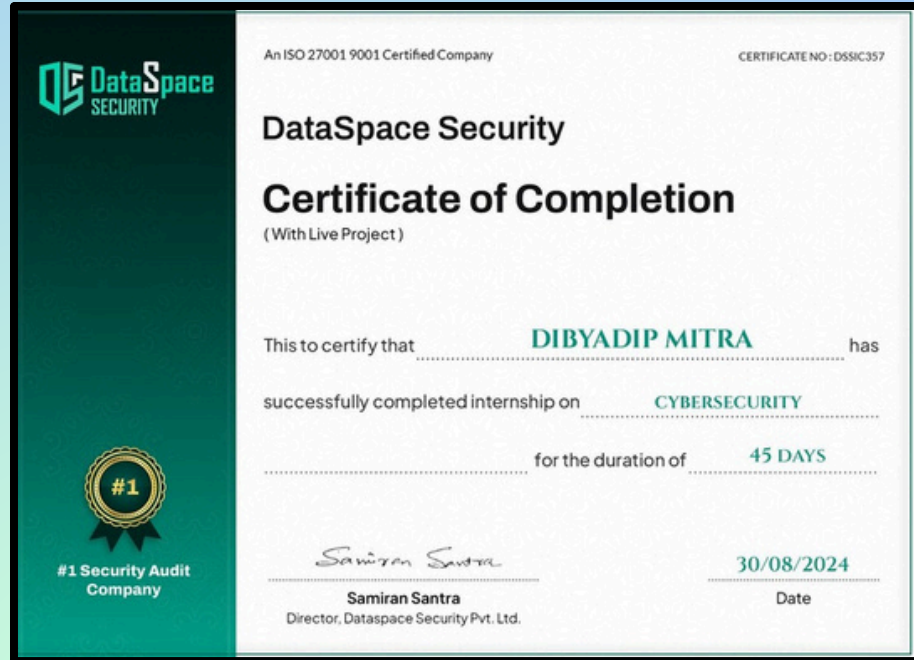
Experts and Rotarians provided guidance, addressing queries and concerns with compassion.

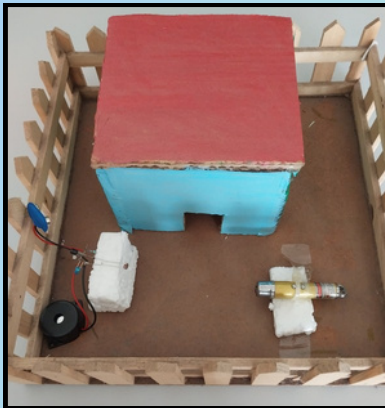

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ARYA GHOSH OF CLASS XII SCIENCE B has prepared this ‘SECURITY ALARM SYSTEM ‘ that can be used both as domestic & commercial purposes.

The components used are Cardboard, Thermocol, Battery (5V), Transistor, Resistor, LDR, Buzzer, Mirror.

Working principle of LDR circuit

The operation of the circuit is based on the principle of a voltage divider. The Light Dependent Resistor (LDR) plays a key role, where its resistance decreases as the intensity of light increases. When the laser beam is focused on the LDR, its resistance drops significantly, allowing the 5V supply to pass through a 10K resistor to ground. As a result, the base of the transistor receives a low voltage signal, keeping the transistor in the OFF state.

However, if the laser beam is interrupted, the light intensity on the LDR reduces, causing its resistance to increase. This higher resistance sends a higher voltage to the base of the transistor, switching it ON. When the transistor turns on, the buzzer is activated, providing an alert. In this way, the circuit functions as a laser-based security system and can keep any place protected.

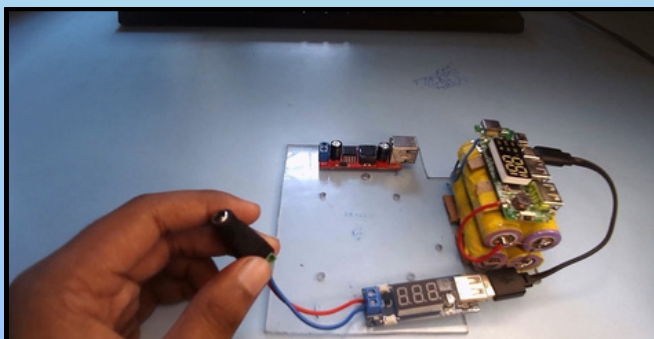
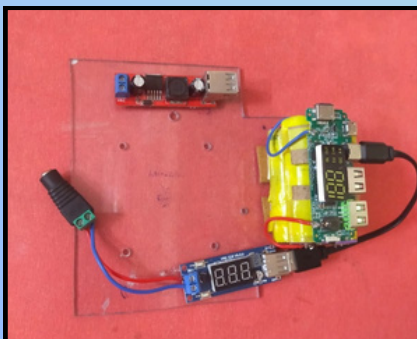
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OFF-GRID POWER MANAGEMENT BOARD – made by ARKADYUTI MAITI , Class – XI Science C

As we can see the coming future, it is evident that there will be expensive use of solar and wind power. Now these clean power supply cannot be directly used to run our houses. Rather we will need an intermediate storage of power in form of a battery. Now this battery also has to be charged using another battery management board. All this comes very expensive nowadays. To solve this issue, this off-grid power management board has been made. It is very cheap compared to the current market price and extremely modular, which makes it easy to use in smaller applications such as shops, streetlights, villages etc., making the use of green and clean energy affordable to everyone, hence increasing the widespread use of solar and wind power.

Innovative pedagogy at AIS

The students of Asian International School, studying in class X, witnessed the effects of refraction of light, observing how light bends and distorts images. This experience was designed to bridge the gap between textbook theories and real-world applications, making complex scientific concepts more accessible and engaging.

The day began with a brief introduction to the principles of light refraction. Physics teachers described to the students how light changes direction when it passes from one medium to another, such as from air to water, and how this bending of light can distort the appearance of objects. Students witnessed the bending effect brought about by refraction by watching a long metal rod immersed in water to demonstrate these phenomena. The idea of true and perceived depth was illustrated by the way the submerged portion of the rod seemed to be bent at the water's surface.

As the students observed the metal rod, they were fascinated by how the rod seemed to bend at the water's surface. This visual demonstration provided a clear example of how refraction can alter the appearance of objects, making them seem closer or further away than they actually are. The teachers then explained the scientific principles underlying this optical illusion,



including how light bends and produces the apparent effect when it passes through various media due to differences in speed.

The practical experiments and ensuing conversations made it easier for the students to understand the idea behind light refraction. They gained a deeper

knowledge of the concepts of apparent and true depth by witnessing and playing with light bending themselves. This interactive approach made learning enjoyable and memorable, sparking the students' interest in science and encouraging them to think critically about the world around them.



AIS students explore plant morphology in field study

Students of class XI at Asian International School engaged in a field study on plant morphology to understand the world of plant structures and forms. With curiosity, the biology teacher guided students to venture into the school gardens to observe some various plants in the Asian International School premises garden. They were able to understand how the characteristics affect a plant's ability to grow, reproduce, and adapt to its environment.

The teacher gave details information to the students on the various plant parts and their functions from the school garden. Students were given the task to observe particular plants of their choice and asked to note their unique features to discuss later. Through direct observation of plants, helped students develop a greater understanding of the beauty of the botanical world.

As they were exploring the gardens, students recorded their observations. With the guidance of the teacher, they examined intricate patterns of leaves, and how the stems branched out to support the whole plant. The different shapes and patterns of flowers also caught their attention, with some flowers displaying symmetry while others more irregular forms. Stems, too, were scrutinized for their structural variations,



from slender, flexible types to thick, woody forms, green forms.

Through these detailed observations, students learned to distinguish between different plant species based on their unique morphological characteristics. By linking these morphological features to their ecological roles and evolutionary advantages, students gained visual knowledge and perception into how plants adapt to our environments and ensure their survival.

With the help of field study, plant morphology has provided students with a holistic learning experience, combining scientific inquiry with a sense of wonder and cherish for nature. By immersing themselves in the natural world and engaging directly with plant life, students developed a depth knowledge of plant growth and adaptation. This educational experience not only broadened their scientific horizons but also inspired a lifelong curiosity about the natural world.

AIS CELEBRATES PREMCHAND DIVAS

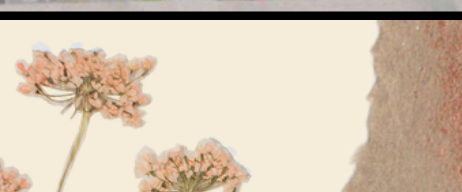

The judging panel consisted of esteemed English teachers, namely Purbasha



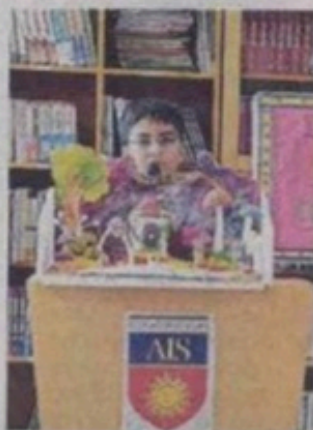

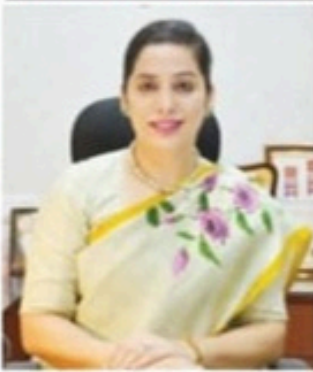

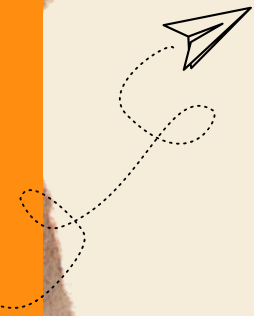
